# Top 5 sectors that employ the most people nationally



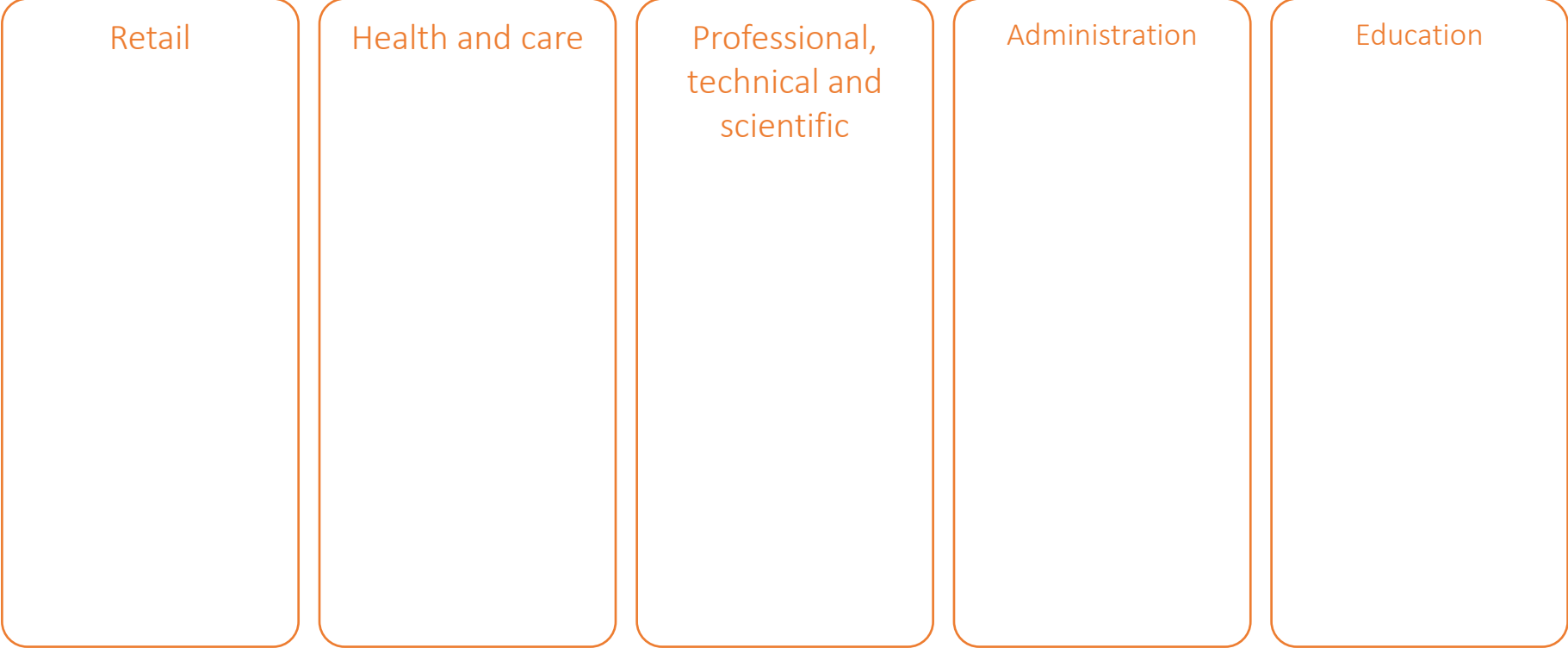

## How important are subject choices?

- Some careers require you to have qualifications in specific subjects
- Do you have a career or sector in mind?
- What are those employers looking for?
- Skills and experiences are also important

60% of employers say that the subjects that you study are important to getting the job that you want

59% of employers also see relevant work experience or having taken up a placement in a relevant sector as an important advantage
